TOURISM AND CULTURAL HERITAGE COMPONENT CALL FOR PROPOSALS

On September 30, 2022, Cames, I.P announced the results of a call for proposals for the development of tourism and cultural heritage sectors in Kenya's coastal counties economic bloc: Kilifi, Kwale, Lamu, Mombasa, Taita-Taveta, Tana-River (JKP - Jumuiya ya Kaunti za Pwani). Civil society, public sector, and private sector organizations were invited to submit project proposals to Jumuiya ya Kaunti za Pwani. The calls were divided into 2 lots: one for civil society and another for the public and private sectors. At the time of publication, 13 organizations were in various phases of contracting for the grant. The grant sum for the projects is EUR 520,000.00.



INDUCTION MEETING BETWEEN THE CALL FOR PROPOSALS (CFP) GRANTEES AND COUNTY GOVERNMENT OF KWALE

Overall, 13 grantees had signed grant contracts by decmber 2022. This paved way for for the TCH Technical Assistance team to commence grantee capacity needs assessment. Part one of capacity needs assessment involved induction meetings between grantees and county directorates of tourism. The first grantee indsuction meeting took place with Kwale county grantees on 14 December 2022.. The meeting identified grantee capacity gaps and opportunities for synergies among Kwale grantees with the county tourism department. The findings helped in designing of group and individual project training and mentorship activities for the CfP grantees as well as enhance relationships between grantees, and the county government

TAITA TAVETA UNIVERSITY LAUNCH THE UBUNTU LEADERS ACADEMY CLUB (ULA)

Taita Taveta University becomes the first university to launch the Ubuntu Leaders Academy (ULA) club in Kenya. The university is located in Taita Taveta County, a member of the Jumuiya ya Kaunti Za Pwani economic bloc. ULA is a program activity of the Go Blue project, a partnership between the European Union and the Government of Kenya to advance the Blue Economy Agenda.

The training, coordinated and conducted by IPAV, has an objective to select and train young people on leadership and social entrepreneurship through the Ubuntu Leaders Academy.

The training took place on 7 to 11 November 2022 and was officially launched by Prof. Christine A. Onyango - Deputy Vice-Chancellor Taita Taveta University. In her launch speech, Prof. Christine urged leaders to inspire others, always lead by example, and create change and impact in the community. The training was conducted by ULA TOTs as part of the sustainability strategy.

Present at the launch were Dr. Mwakio Mwagandi – Taita Taveta University ULA Patron, Shadrack Mutungi, CEC – Youth, Gender, Culture and Social Services and Dr. Bellah Chepkulei – SBESS Dean.

Taita Taveta University also launched ULA club and elected the interim club officials to spearhead the club's activities.

LAUNCH OF GO KENYA COAST

The Go Kenya Coast is a destination management and marketing initiative by the Jumuiya ya Kaunti za Pwani (JKP) focusing on the Coastal Kenya region. The initiative aims at positioning the Kenyan coast as a world-class tourism destination. The initiative's objectives are; to increase opportunities for local communities to participate in the tourism sector and to enhance sustainable economic growth and development along the Kenyan coast while inspiring sustainable tourism practices."

"The Go Kenya Coast Initiative aims at promoting the unique tourism offerings of the nine destinations along the Kenyan coast, including Mombasa, Diani, Watamu, Malindi, Tana River, Hola, Kipini, Lamu, and Taita Taveta's Tsavo Tourism area.

Its goal is to create and enhance memorable experience through showcasing the cultural heritage, landscapes, and wildlife experiences of these destinations. To achieve this, the program will implement branding and promotion strategies that include; developing and managing the GoKenyaCoast destination portal, promoting unique experiences, showcasing cultural heritage of the Kenyan Coast, promoting sustainable tourism practices and collaborating with travel industry partners.

The initiative has developed a cohesive brand identity that encompasses all nine destinations and launched the portal (https://gokenyacoast.co.ke/ver-1/) that offers visitors an immersive experience, featuring interactive maps, virtual tours, and authentic cultural experiences. The launch of the Go Kenya Coast destination rebranding was done during the closing ceremony of the JABEIC 2022 on 9th December 2022.
