GO BLUE OFFICES LAUNCHED

On 25 October 2022, the Go Blue Offices were officially launched and inscribed in Nyali, Mombasa County. Besides launching the physical office, the event was aimed at giving visibility to the blue economy agenda in Kenya, promoting the potential for coastal and marine resources in advancing the socioeconomic livelihoods of the coastal residents and sharing the project activities and outcomes since its inception in January 2021.

Recognising the increasing vulnerabilities of coastal communities and cities occasioned and exacerbated by climate change and environmental degradation despite the rich coastal and marine resources, the Go Blue Project seeks to implement innovative ideas to harness the potential for these resources to improve and strengthen coastal development, mitigate climate impacts while improving the adaptive capacity of the coastal residents.

The event was attended by high-level representatives from the government, including governors from the six coastal counties, ambassadors from participating European Countries, the European Union Delegation to Kenya, and other invited stakeholders.

GO BLUE PROJECT KENYA AT THE WORLD URBAN FORUM, 2022 IN KATOWICE, POLAND

Go Blue project Kenya under the leadership of UN-Habitat, took part in the 11th session of the World Urban Forum held in Katowice, Poland, themed Transforming our cities for a better urban future. On 28 June 2022, Go Blue held a session to engage the participants under the topic; Connecting people, cities, and the ocean for a sustainable and resilient Kenya coast.

The session provided an avenue to highlight some of the key challenges hindering the potential to fully harness coastal and marine resources to promote social and economic prosperity and environmental sustainability. This is in noting the continued climate change risks witnessed among coastal communities. Recognising the direct and indirect relationship between people, their settlements and ocean ecosystems, the session showcased some of the community-led and low-cost technologies for harnessing coastal and marine resources sustainably.

SAFETY FIRST: EXPERTISE FRANCE TRAINS 288 KENYAN FISHERS

Expertise France, in collaboration with the Kenyan Coast Guard Service, trained 288 Kenyan fishers from 18 different Beach Management Units (BMUs) on basic life-saving techniques and safe working conditions. The training took place in June 2022.

In addition to gaining new safety skills and knowledge, each fisher received a life jacket and a waterproof pocket for their phones in case of need to call for help. The training is part of the maritime security component of the Go Blue project, a joint initiative to advance the Blue Economy agenda across six Kenyan coastal Counties. Over the following months, Expertise France and the Kenyan Coast Guard Service will be rolling out the safety training course to other BMUs spread across Kenya's coastal counties, intending to benefit around 1,600 to 2,000 fishers.

MARITIME SECURITY COMPONENT LAUNCH

The maritime security component of the Go Blue Project, which Expertise France is implementing was launched on 25 October 2022 at the Bamburi Beach Management Unit.

The EUR 5,000,000.00 (€ 5 million) initiative will be implemented across all six counties in Kenya's coast region: Kwale, Lamu, Taita Taveta, Mombasa, Tana River and Kilifi counties.

The main aim of the Go Blue maritime security project is to strengthen the capacity of the Kenya Coast Guard Service and other national and regiona agencies involved in maritime security, by promoting a culture of information exchange, cooperation and collaboration.

In addition, other activities will be set up such as a community on the water watch programme, including fishermen safety courses and the development of a mobile phone application to enhance safety and security at sea, as well as support and improve the search and rescue (SAR) chain across the coastal counties.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AND MATCHING (TVET)

GIZ is providing labour-market-oriented and industry-led, modularized Competency Based Education and Training (CBET). Six modularized CBET curricula in the blue economy have developed and validated, and we partnerd with nine VTCs of which six have been upgraded to BE TVET Centers of Excellence (CoE). So far, 2,219 youths completed the courses. Out of them, 1,933 have been placed in jobs/self-employment. The curricula have been digitalized and the CoE been equipped with a customized e-learning platform.

BLUE ECONOMY MSME SUPPORT

MSME labs have been integrated in the partner VTCs, offering Business Development Services (BDS) to improve the competitiveness of MSMEs in blue value chains. GIZ so far has enhanced capacity of 545 business through acceleration and incubation services.

AQUACULTURE VALUE CHAIN DEVELOPMENT

GIZ Go Blue applies a holistic and integrated value chain development approach for aquaculture, through addressing key bottlenecks to unlock the potential. So far, 1,898 aquaculture enterprises have been supported, with 517 enterprises trained on tilapia value chains and in the mariculture sector, 1,381 MSMEs have gained knowledge to improve their businesses based on technical and business trainings. Another key achievement is the training of 226 aquaculture master trainers, and the developed Level 6 Aquaculture TVET with Pwani University, validated by TVETA. Short practical courses will be rolled out in all six coastal counties in partner VTCs in 2023. The future is bright for the coastal aquaculture sector in Kenya.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF MWARUA, A FISHERMAN FROM MTWAPA

The Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (Aics) through the Go Blue initiative, funded by the European Union and realized in partnership with the Government of Kenya, is supporting Mtwapa BMU and eight other BMUs across the five coastal counties through a set of interventions which also include the provision of boats, fishing gears and fishing equipment which will empower fishermen and allow them to boost their activity. In addition to the provision of the equipment, which is expected to be delivered during the months of March and April 2023, Aics through its technical partner CIHEAM Bari is currently working to establish a sustainable mechanism to ensure greater access to fishing equipment according to a boat distribution scheme that will be designed according to each BMU's size and capacity. The scheme, which will work similarly to a revolving fund, will allow each BMU to save and accumulate money to purchase additional boats. The objective is to secure and boost access to productive resources inputs, enhancing the performance and the revenues of fishermen like Mwarua.

CHRISTINE'S CASSAVA: FROM LAND, DREAMS CAN BE BORN

Through the support of the 'Go Blue' project funded by the European Union, the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICs), through the technical partnership of the Mediterranean Agronomic Institute of Bari (CIHEAM Bari) is supporting the construction of a cassava processing plant powered by solar energy which will allow for peeling, chopping and dry cassava for flour production. Flour is a product that can be sold at a higher price than fresh cassava and which guarantees a higher income for farmers. The construction works, which started in October, are entrusted to the community under the supervision of the County of Kwale to enhance ownership.
